Know What:

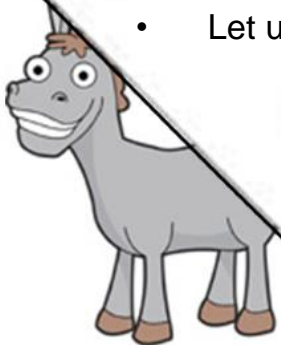
- Today is the third week we are discovering more about the stories Jesus told, normally called parables. Last week we looked at the Lost Son, this week it's the Good Samaritan.
- A parable is an earthly story with a heavenly truth.
- Today's parable can be found in Luke 10:25-37.
- A clever man, who knew God's laws 'inside out' knew he had to love God and his neighbour, but he wasn't sure who his neighbour really was.
- Jesus told the story to answer his question, showing that truly loving someone meant going out of your way to help, regardless of who they are – so really, anyone can be your 'neighbour'.
- The story was about a man who was hurt, but for various reasons no one helped him. In the end, a Samaritan -who were usually looked down on by God's people- helped him. This showed true love.

Reading

Luke 10:

25 On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. “Teacher,” he asked, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?”

26 “What is written in the Law?” he replied. “How do you read it?”

27 He answered, “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind’[a]; and, ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’[b]”

28 “You have answered correctly,” Jesus replied. “Do this and you will live.”

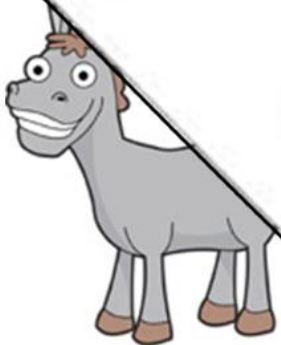
29 But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

30 In reply Jesus said: “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. 31 A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. 32 So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. 35 The next day he took out two denarii[c] and gave them to the innkeeper. ‘Look after him,’ he said, ‘and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.’

36 “Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?”

37 The expert in the law replied, “The one who had mercy on him.”

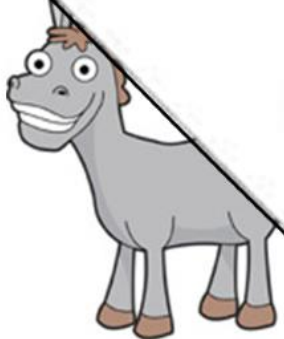

- How can you help if you find someone who is hurt?



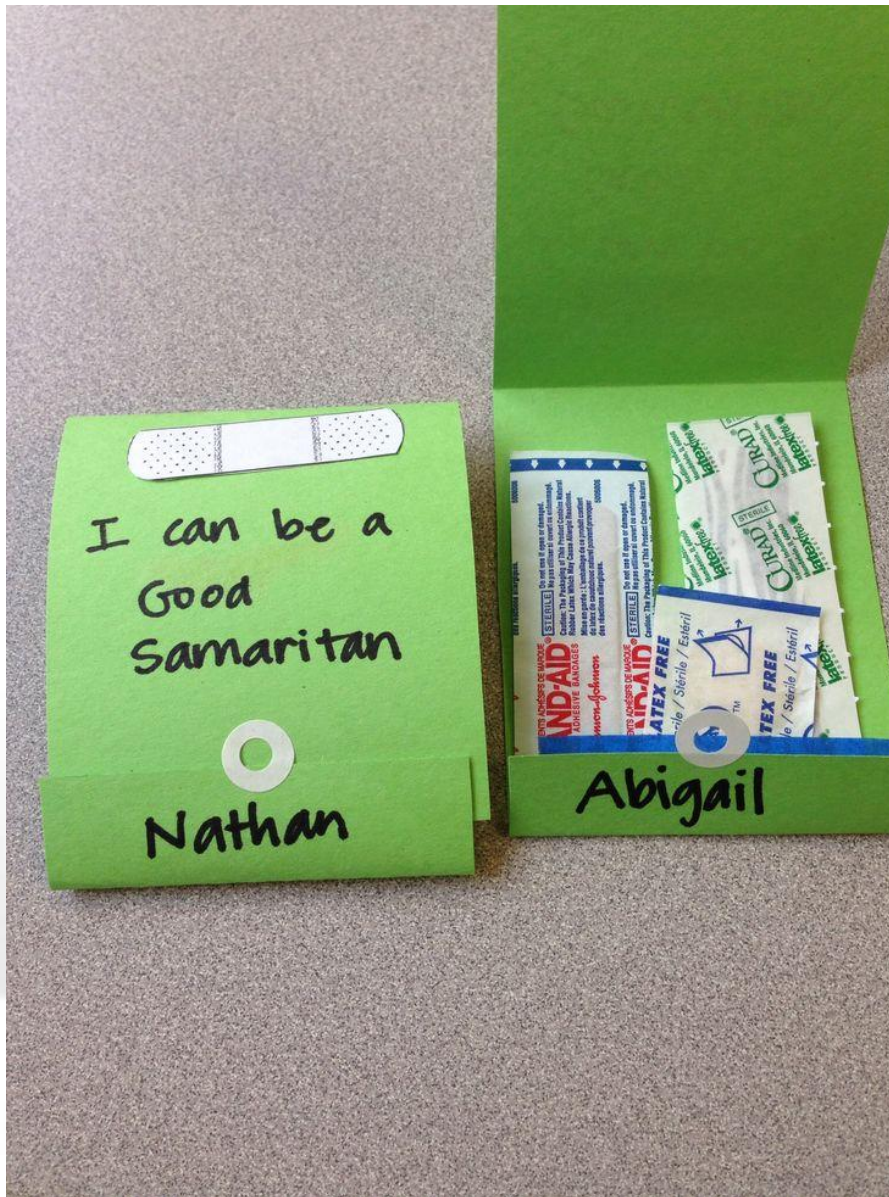

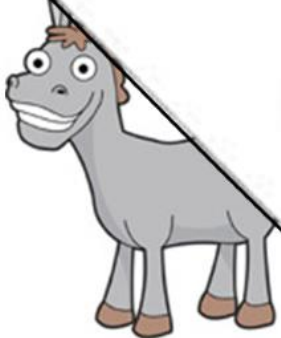
Our Father in heaven,

Give us today our daily bread,



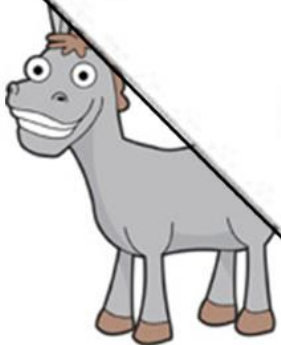
And forgive us our sins,

deliver us from evil.

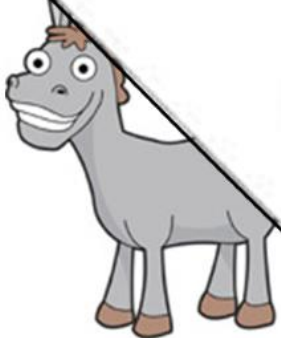

Some of us are big and tall

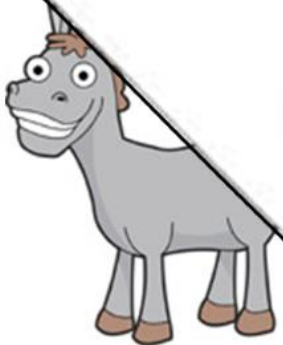
Some of us are very small

Some of us like pink and some like blue

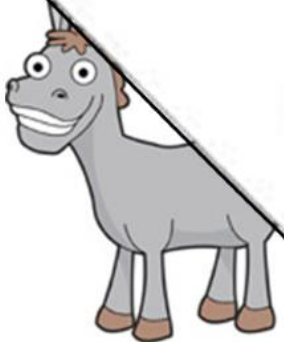
Some of us like reading books

Some of us like feeding ducks

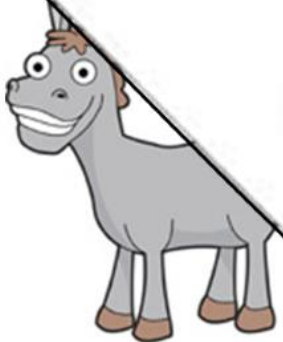
That's because we're different,
me and you....



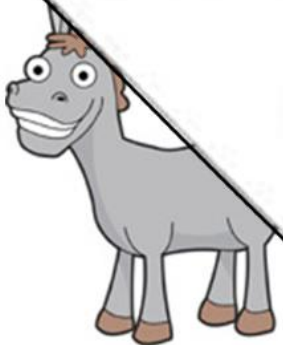
But God loves everyone he's made
God loves each of us in a special way



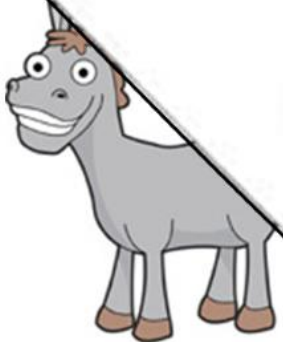
That's you and you and you and you

We're part of the big family of God



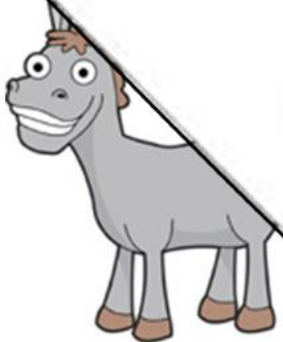
Some of us have curly hair

God loves each of us in a special way



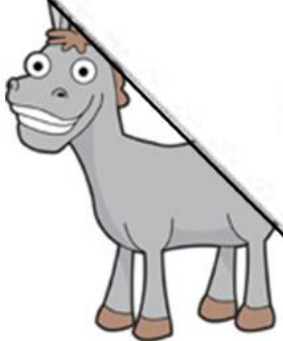
